### OSSD REQUIREMENTS

In order to receive a high school diploma, each student needs to complete **30 credits** which include:

- 4 ENGLISH
- 1 FRENCH
- 3 MATH (1 SENIOR)
- 2 SCIENCE
- 1 CANADIAN GEOGRAPHY
- 1 CANADIAN HISTORY
- 1 ARTS (DRAMATIC, VISUAL, MUSIC)
- 1 PHYSICAL EDUCATION
- .5 CIVICS
- .5 CAREER STUDIES
- 1 GROUP 1 ELECTIVE (FRENCH, SOC. SCIENCE, ETC)
- 1 GROUP 2 ELECTIVE (PE, ART BUSINESS, ETC)
- 1 GROUP 3 ELECTIVE (SCIENCE, TECH, ETC)

AND 12 ADDITIONAL ELECTIVES

## General Information

- University admission requires an OSSD and a minimum of six 4U and/or 4M courses.
- “U” English is a requirement for all university programs but “U” math and science is not a requirement for all university programs.
- There is a growing demand for people in the skilled trades (college/apprenticeship pathways)
- There are many ways to transfer from college to university (ontransfer.ca)
- College admission requires an OSSD with most courses at C level or higher.
